My name is Ahmad Mostafa abu-Rabia Sulaym, and I'm a 13-year-old Bedouin from the Arabian desert. I'm an artist, and I'm sending two of my pictures. They show the type of clothes that we wear in our community. Every month we have a new article about clothes and culture. This month we're talking to Ahmad Mostafa.
